

LA SCALA THEATER AND HIS MUSEUM

The story of the Museo Teatrale alla Scala started in 1911, when Duke Uberto Visconti di Modrone, Professor Lodovico Pagliaghi, the composer and librettist Arrigo Boito, the correspondent of II Secolo Mr Borsa, Senator Mangili, Count Leopoldo Pullè and Ettore Modigliani, director of the Pinacoteca di Brera gathered around a table of the Teatro alla Scala. Take a visit to the Theatre Museum to explore its vast collections, the Livia Simoni library and look out over the auditorium.

Tailor-made guided tours are available for tourists looking for a more "behind-the-scenes" experience. These tours must be booked in advance. Depending on the type of tour, your guide will take you on to the celebrated La Scala stage, into the famous royal box, into gold boxes and into the recently restored auditorium to uncover the hidden gems of La Scala, the prompter's box, the impressive chandelier, the new fly tower, and other areas of interest.

Or you may wish to book a special guided tour of the fascinating Ansaldo Workshops, where our specialist production artists design and create the staging, costumes, wigs and everything else that you'll see on stage in our opera and ballet performances.
